Ecosystem Collapse is Accelerating— Restoration Begins with **All as One**

Our planet is at a critical juncture, facing rapid ecosystem collapse

- Accelerating Deforestation: Rainforests, a vital carbon sinks and biodiversity hotspots, are experiencing unprecedented deforestation rates, threatening global climate stability.
- Indigenous communities not only curb deforestation but better restore deforested land in their territories than the privately owned and unincorporated lands around them. (PNAS 2023)
- By **empowering** Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities (IPLC) — the world's most effective guardians of biodiversity — with **streamlined funding**, we can restore critical ecosystems and reshape global restoration.

Huge Funding Disparities exist:

- Yet **less than 7% of funds** promised at COP conferences reach IPLC. (Indigenous Peoples and Local Communities Forest Tenure Pledge)
- **Globally, they receive less than 1%** of global conservation funding (Funding with Purpose Report)— **an unacceptable funding gap ALL1 thrives to close.**



Indigenous-Centric Regeneration: Proven Solutions



Though just 6% of the global population, Indigenous Peoples safeguard the majority of the world's biodiversity, shielding ecosystems from collapse. Funding Indigenous-centric restoration isn't an option—it's a necessity.

- 50% lower deforestation on Indigenous-managed lands (FAO & FILAC, 2021)
- 42 billion metric tons of CO₂ stored in Amazonian Indigenous territories (PNAS, 2018)

Case Study 1: The Paiter Suruí Forest Carbon Project

- **Innovative Conservation:** In 2009, the Paiter Suruí launched the first indigenous-led forest carbon project, generating 299,895 Verified Carbon Units (VCUs), equivalent to removing 64,000 cars from the road for a year.
- **Sustainable Livelihoods:** Proceeds from carbon offset sales funded sustainable community initiatives, including the harvesting of medicinal plants and artisanal handicrafts, reinforcing traditional practices and economic resilience.

Case Study 2: The Xingu Seed Network

- **Community-Driven Reforestation:** Established in 2007, the Xingu Seed Network comprises 647 collectors from Indigenous and local communities, facilitating the restoration of over 8,800 hectares of degraded land through the sale of 353 tons of native seeds. (socioambiental.org)
- **Economic Empowerment:** Seed collection and sales have generated approximately 2.5 million reais (around \$800,000 USD) for participating communities, promoting sustainable land use and forest conservation. (believe.earth)

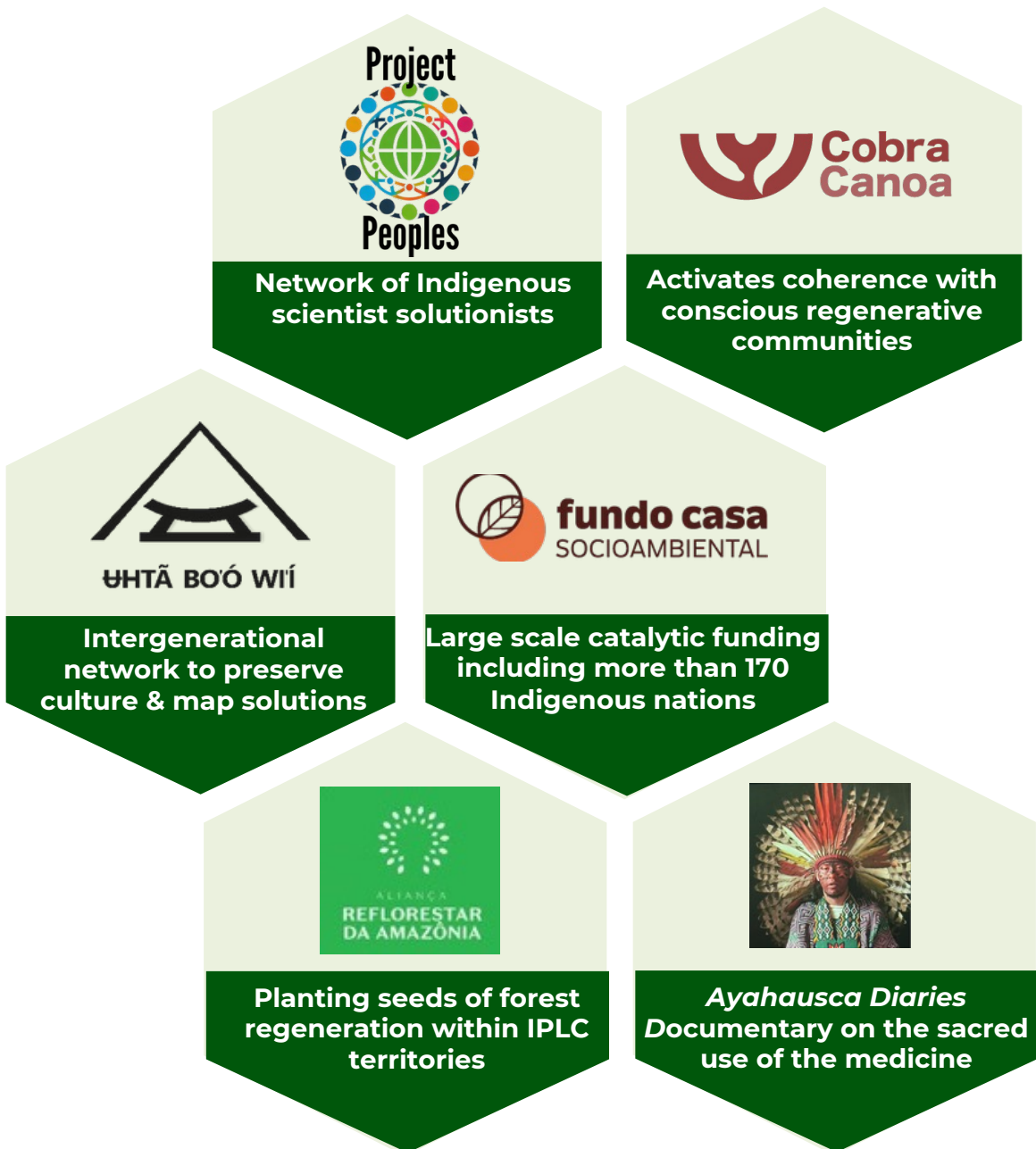
Scaling Impact Through Network Effects

The ALL1.eco funding portal will be an engine driving long-term restoration finance, ensuring IPLC access resources quickly and efficiently. We enable systemic Investment for an entire ecosystem using the Cobra Canoa Framework - Catalytic funding by a dual approach.

Ecosystem Catalysis Approach

We fund strategic leverage points (IPLC funds, grassroots movements and policy makers) to shift the paradigms and mindset of an entire ecosystem.

During the development phase we boost these strategic partners' critical work with \$500k each, along with funds for other key players.



Bioregional Regeneration Pathway

A Holistic Conservation Model: Regenerative Bioregions

Instead of fragmented efforts, our intercultural council proposes piloting holistic systemic investing in three bioregional corridors, where IPLC lead the restoration of vast, interconnected landscapes.

These regions will seek blended capital for regenerative ventures with philanthropy, impact investing, government subsidies, and low interest loans.





ALL1.eco Governance Structure



ALL1 Family (all1family.org)

- Indigenous leaders and international experts
- To be incorporated as **501(c)3 nonprofit** in the U.S.
- **Holding organization** which will own the Intellectual Property of the PBC and receive **profits to circulate back down to grassroots initiatives for regeneration.**



ALL1.eco PBC, Inc. (all1.eco)

- Will channel funding to grassroots regenerative projects.
- Registered **Public Benefit Corporation (PBC) in New York to be majority owned by the nonprofit.**
- Will raise capital to market and scale the fundraising portal.



ALL1.eco Consulting, LLC (all1consulting.com)

- Manages regenerative ventures and consulting opportunities.
- **For profit Limited Liability Corporation.**
- Promotes products sourcing ingredients from grassroots Indigenous regenerative projects.

- Design multibillion-dollar campaign

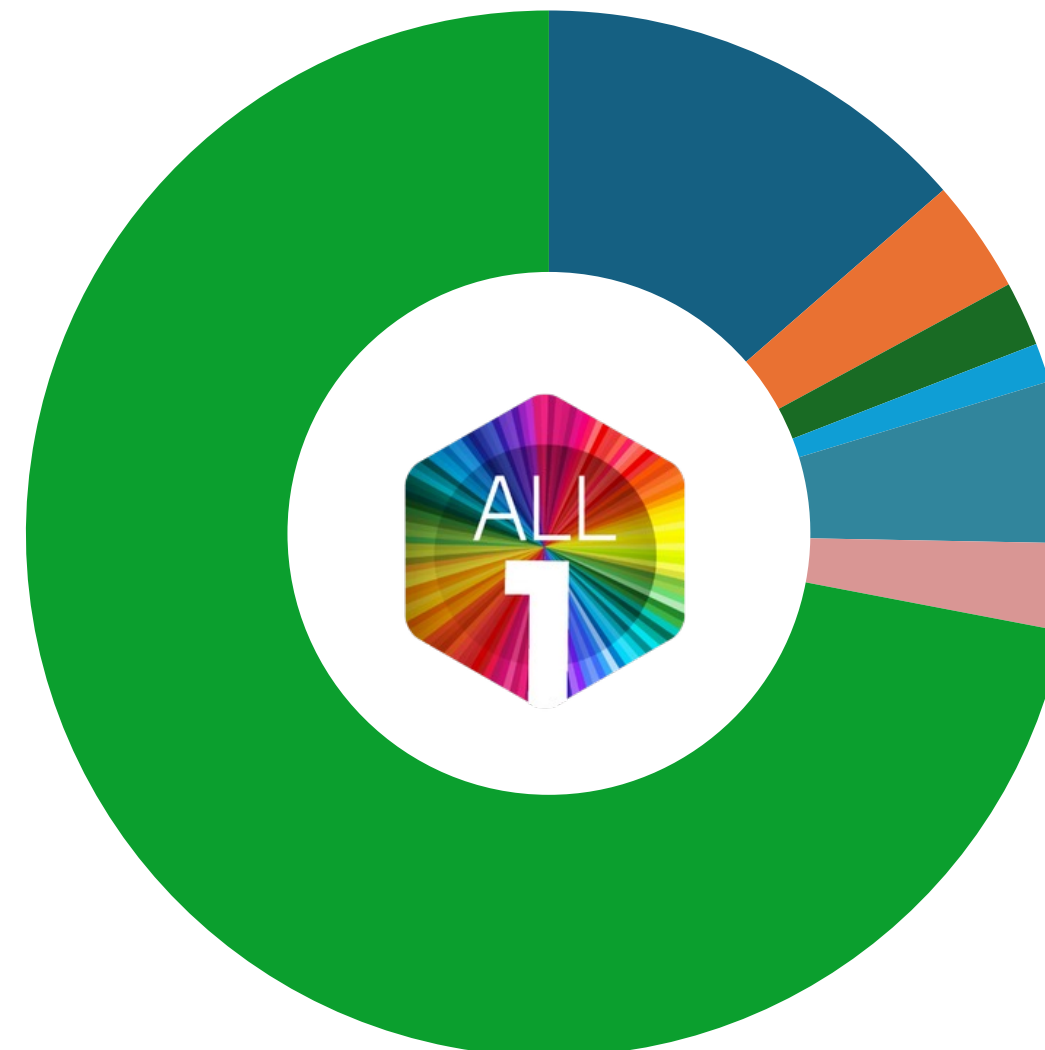
Phase 2 - PBC Founder Round (Fall 2025-Spring 2026): \$~5M

Phase 2 - Sources of PBC Revenue

- “Tip box” model for donations similar to DonorsChoose.org
- 1% transaction fee on donations and other activity on the platform
- Referral fees from investment platforms
- Transaction fees from sales of regenerative products
- Content development and placement
- Consulting services (new regenerative product ventures, business strategy support, marketing support, etc.)

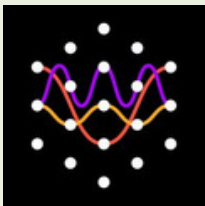
